PROPER CLEANING, SANITIZING OR DISINFECTING



- SPRAY CLEANING SOLUTION ONTO SURFACE (SOAP AND WATER/ OR A DETERGENT PREPARED ACCORDING TO MANUFACTURER'S LABEL INSTRUCTIONS).
- WIPE SURFACE WITH A SINGLE USE PAPER TOWEL, SINGLE USE MICROFIBER CLOTH, OR MOP.
- RINSE, THEN AIR DRY OR DRY WITH A SINGLE USE PAPER TOWEL OR MICROFIBER CLOTH.
- APPLY SANITIZER OR DISINFECTANT TO SURFACE. ALLOW PRODUCT TO STAY WET ON SURFACE FOR TIME INSTRUCTED ON PRODUCT LABEL (DWELL TIME).
- AIR DRY, OR AFTER DWELL TIME, DRY WITH A SINGLE USE PAPER TOWEL OR MICROFIBER CLOTH.
- Sanitize surfaces that touch food (dishes, cutting boards, or mixed-use tables), or objects that a child might place in their mouth (toys).



Disinfect equipment and surfaces that are used in toileting or diapering and in cleaning body fluids.

Choose an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Registered Disinfectant and follow label instructions! Select a product certified by the EPA by using this link.



- Some sanitizers/ disinfectants (products) are ready-to-use and some need to be diluted with water. • Check label for the dwell time.
- When applying the sanitizer or disinfectant, be sure to look at the clock or set a timer!
- Some products require a rinse step.
 Check product for expiration date.
- If using bleach, solutions should be made daily, according to manufacturer's label instructions.
- Do not use sanitizers or disinfectants near children!
- Be careful to spray away from people and provide ventilation.

Keep all toxic substances out of the reach of children.

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
